Become a Registered Neighborhood

Blight Elimination

Report blight to the Code Compliance Department to start the code enforcement process. For over height weeds, trash, litter or debris, fences in disrepair, open and vacant buildings, abandoned vehicles, call Code at 623/930-3610. Graffiti

Report graffiti by calling or call the city's Graffiti Removal Hotline at 623/930-3080 for assistance with removal. To report graffiti in progress, please call 911.

Tool Lending
