Workshop Description:

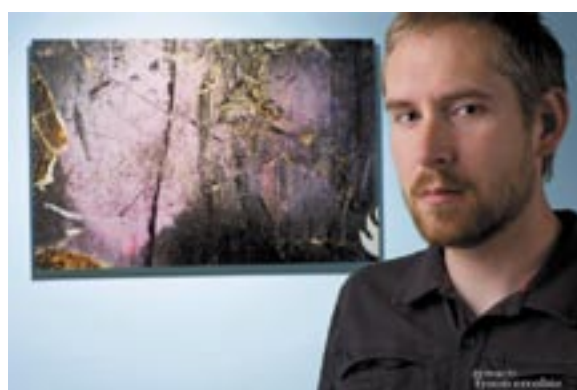
