

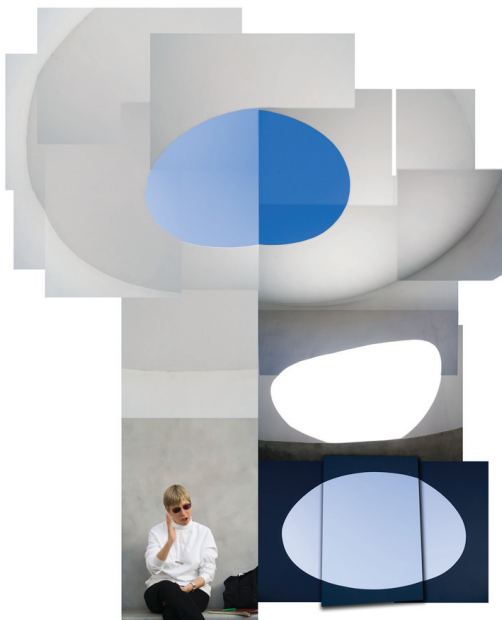

● **Art in Public Places.** Betsy Fahlman, Ph.D., will discuss the history and variety of local and regional public art programs in Arizona. Dr. Fahlman is a professor of art history at ASU, and a specialist in American art. Lecture is at 7 p.m. on December 11th.

● **Gallery Representation for Emerging Artists.** Valerie Hopkins will walk participating artists through the process of presenting artworks to galleries for the upcoming seasons in Arizona and Santa Fe, New Mexico.

Ms. Hopkins, a former Scottsdale gallery owner, runs an arts consulting business in Glendale. Her talk begins at 6:30 p.m. on December 18th.
