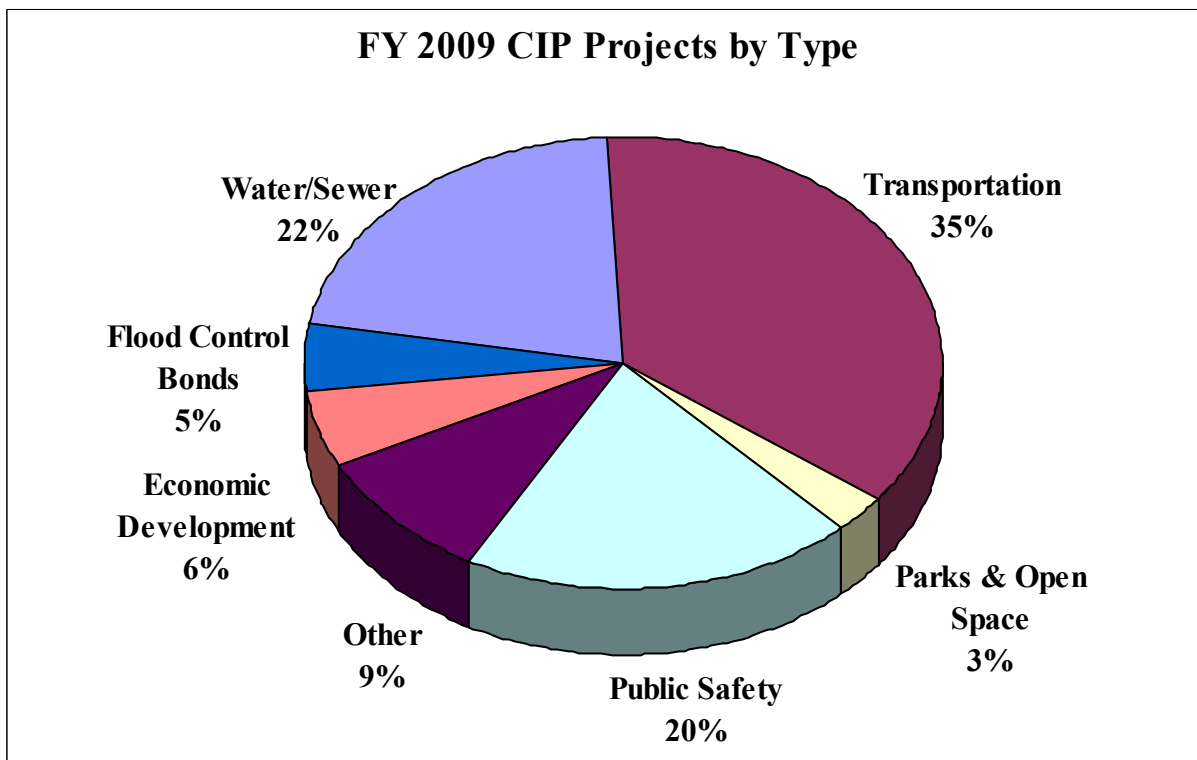


SUMMARY BY TYPE OF PROJECT

Glendale's capital improvement plan contains a wide range of projects that make up a well-rounded, long-range program for municipal improvements.

One of the most useful ways to view the CIP and understand its components is to group projects into similar types or categories. Since city revenue sources are often limited to specific categories (e.g., streets, water/sewer utility) and bonds are authorized by major categories (e.g., public safety, parks), this approach is also helpful when evaluating bond issues. The graph below shows FY 2009 CIP projects by major category type (does not include carryover).



The following section includes a summary of all capital projects by fund. A narrative description of the major CIP categories precedes the project detail sheets for each project. Each detail sheet contains a project identification number and name, a short project description, the anticipated funding source, projected costs for each of the first five years (including carryover funding from the previous years CIP, if applicable), a five-year aggregate estimate for the second five years and the operating impact, if any. This year the operating impact is expanded to show how much will be spent on personnel, supplies, utilities, insurance, etc. along with a description of the operating impact.

New projects are identified with an asterisk --*-- in the project's title for the detailed description of each project. Projects that do not have funding in the first year are assigned a "T" (temporary) number until design or construction begins.
