




Pyramid Peak Water Treatment Plant *Improvement Project*

The Glendale Water Services Department is hosting a community open house to share information about upcoming water treatment plant capacity expansion and process improvements being implemented at the Pyramid Park Water Treatment Plant located east of Pyramid Peak Parkway and north of Pinnacle Vista Drive.

This needed process and capacity project will improve plant reliability and provide the ability to meet increasing service demand associated with area growth and development. The plant's treatment capacity will increase by 15 million gallons per day over the plant's current 39 million gallons per day treatment capacity.

PROJECT OVERVIEW: Originally constructed in 1986, Pyramid Peak Water Treatment Plant is operated by the City of Glendale and owned jointly with the City of Peoria since 1996, when the plant underwent an earlier capacity expansion.

The current project includes replacement or rehabilitation of obsolete equipment and processes to ensure the plant's operational reliability and efficiency. The plant treatment capacity expansion includes the installation of new water treatment structures on the east side of the existing plant and within the plant site perimeter to increase the volume of water that can be treated.

PROJECT SCHEDULE: The project will be implemented in phases with intermittent plant improvements scheduled to begin in 2018. All work activity will take place onsite and measures will be taken during construction to minimize the impact to nearby residences. Project completion is projected for 2020.
