If so, turn the page to see the wide range of titles available.

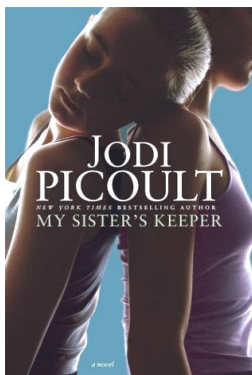

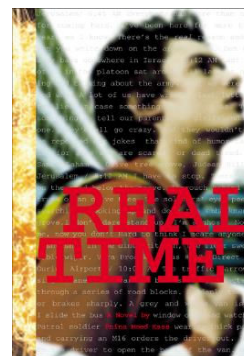

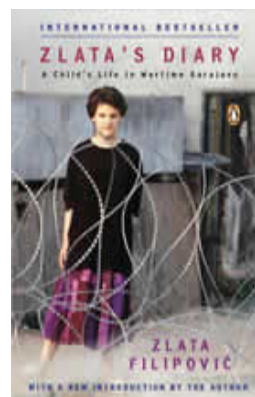

• ☐ **Hugo and Nebula Awards:** both of these awards annually recognize outstanding works of science fiction. The **Hugo Awards** (awards dating back to 1946) are awarded by the World Science Fiction Society and is also known as the Science Fiction Achievement Award. The **Nebula Awards** (since 1965) are nominated and voted on by members of the Science Fiction and Fantasy Writers of America and are awarded to best novel, novella, novelette and short story in the science fiction and/or fantasy genres.
