

City of Glendale Planning Commission Rezoning Initiative

The City of Glendale Planning Commission recently embarked upon a city-wide initiative to rezone property consisting of approximately 18 city parks, public facilities, and other city-owned property. Several public schools adjacent to city parks will also be rezoned.

The purpose of this initiative is to bring the zoning of the property into conformance with the City's General Plan. This information has been provided to help you understand why the Planning Commission is working on this project. Q. Why did the Planning Commission undertake this initiative?

A. When the zoning of a property is not consistent with the General Plan land use designation, it weakens the General Plan. This initiative will strengthen the General Plan by bringing the zoning district into conformance with the General Plan land use designation.

Q. What parks, libraries and other facilities are being rezoned?

A. Currently the following city-owned property has been or is scheduled to be rezoned:

- Butler Park/Glendale American School
- Bonsall Park North and Bonsall Park South
- Foothills Library and Foothills Park
- Foothills Public Safety Facility
- O'Neil Park
- Cholla Park/Desert Palm Elementary School
- Mondo Park
- Fire Station 154
- Lawrence Park
- Lions Park
- Ocotillo Rose Park
- Mission Park
- Horizon Park/Horizon Elementary School
- Country Gables Park
- Kings Park
- Paseo Racquet Center and Park

Q. Will this initiative change the existing land use for my neighborhood park, or other city facility?

A. No. There are **no changes** proposed to any of the property being rezoned. The purpose of this undertaking is to strengthen the General Plan by bringing the zoning into conformance with General Plan land use.
