## IMPORTANT TRAFFIC INFORMATION FOR UPCOMING CARDINALS GAME

**GLENDALÉ, Ariz.** – Football fans need to be aware of suggested routes and important traffic information that will help make this year’s Cardinals season a success off the field.

Season ticket holders have received parking passes from the Arizona Cardinals with specific parking and traffic instructions. Again this year, maps to the assigned parking lots are printed on the back side of parking passes.

Here is information that fans need to be aware of for this season:

- **NEW!!** – Game day parking is now available at the Glendale Renaissance Parking Garage. Fans can pay to park on game day for \$10 or they can purchase a “season pass” for \$80 for all ten Cardinals home games. No grilling will be allowed in the parking garage and drivers must access the garage from the north, via 95<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
- Parking for single game ticket holders is at Kellis High School lot, located on the east side of 91<sup>st</sup> Avenue just north of Orangewood Avenue. Similar to last season, a free shuttle service will run between the high school and the stadium beginning two hours before game time and ending one hour following the game.
- The Brown Lot, which is south of Kellis High School is used for permitted parking only.
- After the game, there will be reversible lanes on Maryland, west of 95<sup>th</sup> Ave, as well as 91<sup>st</sup> Avenue, south of 6250.

“Fans should arrive early and plan out a route prior to arriving,” said Glendale Senior Principal Traffic Engineer Debbie Albert. “Also, fans should not assume that the only approach to the stadium is to exit Glendale Ave. or Bethany Home Rd., but that there are other options such as Northern and Camelback Road that will allow people to gain access to the area.”

To safely move pedestrians in the area, 95<sup>th</sup> Avenue west of the stadium and Maryland Avenue between 93<sup>rd</sup> and 95<sup>th</sup> Avenues will be closed to vehicle traffic.

The city of Glendale has partnered with ADOT to provide real-time traffic information, and fans are encouraged to call **511** for updated traffic information.

Glendale Police will be directing traffic to establish a safe and steady traffic flow. Follow traffic signs for direction.
