## A Message from Mayor **Jerry P. Weiers**

"Another Year of Milestones"

Looking back on the last 12 months I am filled with pride and satisfaction with the continued positive financial outlook, solidified partnerships and successful community events in 2018.

The year 2018 kicked off with the 21st Glendale University class learning about the inner-workings of their city. Soon after, I had the pleasure of being part of a police vehicle program among the Chamber, City of Glendale and Puerto Penasco.

March brought about Glendale's State of the City Address event – the largest in history. I was proud to stand before Glendale Councilmembers, city management, community and business leaders and provide a testimonial list of many of the wonderful things happening in Glendale.

In April, my office helped host the 2nd Annual Induction Ceremony to honor high school seniors in Glendale who chose to enter the military.

In June the city passed its budget which maintained property tax rates, reinforced financial responsibility and kept our goal of a \$50 million fund balance in sight.

In Sept., I represented Glendale in the Sister Cities program in Ørland, Norway, and participated in the Frank Luke 100th Anniversary Memorial Ceremony in Murvaux, France. Also, the 6th Annual Stand Up for Veterans event successfully helped 410 veterans and their families.

We finished the year strong with a first-ever Thunderbird Conservation Park U.S. Flag Raising event and Veterans Day celebration, the annual Hope for Hunger food drive, the 25th Anniversary Glendale Glitters weekend opener and the Hometown Christmas Parade.
