Visitors will find their traditional festival favorites, including holiday entertainment, food, seasonal gifts, a children's snowfield, holiday storytelling, and, the big guy himself, Santa Claus. The Countdown to Glendale Glitters stage show begins on Friday, November 23 at 5:30 p.m.

A Message from Councilmember Ian Hugh

Technology is now an intricate part of our day-to-day lives which increases the possibility for scams and consumer fraud. Residents are encouraged to be aware of the following to reduce your risk of being affected. Monitoring your credit cards and bank accounts regularly is a large key to reducing your likelihood of being a victim. The following tips are straight from our very own Glendale Police Department.

- Gas Pump Skimming. Devices are installed inside the credit card reader at the gas pump that skim the card information that can be duplicated and used.
 - Tip: Run your card as credit or pay inside.
- Work from Home Scams. If it seems too good to be true, it probably is.
 - Tip: Research the job and company to ensure they are legitimate.
- Power company "scams" where caller claims they work for company and you owe money to stop utility being turned off or sent to collections. The caller ID can even "spoof" the company contact information.
 - Tip: Don't rely on caller ID and you can always ask for representative information and call company back on published contact number.
- School Advertising Scam. Beware of "media" company calling to sell advertising space on behalf of a local school.
 - Tip: Contact school administrators directly to confirm fundraising activity.
- Other TIPS:
 - Paper checks are easily counterfeited so try to minimize your use of them.
 - Set up account alerts with your financial institutions allowing you to catch suspicious transactions.

Pedestrian Safety HAWK Signals in Glendale

Pedestrian safety is a top priority for the City of Glendale. A HAWK (High-Intensity Activated CrossWalk) is a pedestrian beacon that resembles a traffic light aimed to keep pedestrians safer when crossing. The beacons are pedestrian activated at both sides of the crosswalk. Drivers stop when the red beacons are flashing and proceed safely once

the pedestrian has crossed.

There are four HAWK signals currently installed in Glendale.
