The Family Bike Ride Rolls through Glendale April 22 – Earth Day!

The City of Glendale is gearing up for the annual Glendale Family Bike Ride on Sunday, April 22 at Sahuaro Ranch Park (59th Ave. & Mountain View). Join hundreds of riders on Earth Day for wonderful weather and great exercise. This ride is FREE for all ages and skill levels! The ride will feature three routes — short (6 miles), long (15 miles) and extended (23 miles). Bicyclists will take a leisurely ride through neighborhoods that highlight Glendale bike lanes and pathways. The extended route also showcases the 63rd Avenue pedestrian/bicycle bridge.

The ride begins at 8 a.m. and all riders must be on the road by 9 a.m. Snacks and water are provided at rest stops along the routes. Helmets are required for all participants. If you need a helmet, they will be available at the event or recycle your old helmet for a new one while supplies last.

New this year is a Bike Rodeo at the park for young riders to learn about bike safety on a mock course. There will also be a bike check-up station, bicycle safety information, health and wellness booths, music and kid's activities. The first



500 riders that register and attend will receive an event t-shirt and all riders that complete the ride will receive a keepsake medal. A Message from Councilmember **Joyce V. Clark**

Let's Make a Good First Impression

I'm a senior now but I remember as a child that whenever my Mom knew we were going to have visitors to our home her first words were, "Kids, go clean your rooms." Mom wanted everything to be neat and tidy when our visitors arrived.

Why reminisce? Because it has its own lesson for us today. We all love Glendale or it wouldn't be our home of choice. Every day Glendale has visitors whether they are attending a sporting event, shopping or looking for their next forever home. Just as my Mom wanted to make a good first impression so, too, should we.

How can we make sure Glendale is neat and tidy for our visitors? We tend to forget about or even ignore Code regulations regarding our properties.

One of these is monthly loose trash collection. Immediately after having loose trash picked up, some residents put out a new pile that sits in front of their homes for nearly a month. Please remember to save your loose trash and to only put it out a few days before collection.

Another is front yard parking. If you park on your front side yard it must be on an improved surface. For those who have paved or poured concrete in their entire front yard you cannot park on more than 30% of that surface. Just as my Mom wanted to make a good impression for her visitors, it is up to each of us to make sure Glendale is neat and tidy for our visitors.

Is Your Property in a Designated Flood Hazard Area?

Did you know some parts of Glendale are designated by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) as being in a special flood hazard area (SFHA)? Properties in these areas are required to purchase flood insurance as part of their home mortgage. However, other sections of the city are subject to flooding that are not shown on the Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM).

Glendale's Engineering Department has copies of the updated FIRMs for the entire city and can let you know if your property is in a special flood hazard area and may be able to let you know if flooding has been reported in your area in the past. The city's Engineering department also has copies of the most recent FEMA elevation certificates for some structures within the city as well as the updated floodplain ordinance on file.

All properties within Glendale can obtain flood insurance whether or not you are in a designated flood area. Remember, most standard homeowners' policies do not cover flood loss. INFO: 623-930-3630 or to submit an electronic request go to www.glendaleaz.com/engineering/mapsandrecords.cfm
