### Fall 2020 Household Hazardous Waste Schedule

Dispose of unwanted household hazardous waste products by scheduling an at-home pickup between September 21 and October 16. An itemized list is needed, so please have that ready when you call to schedule your appointment. The actual collections will be handled October 12 through October 30. Call the Solid Waste Division at 623-930-2660 to make your appointment.

Hazardous materials that will be accepted include paints and wood stains, antifreeze and other automotive fluids, motor oil and filters, car batteries, pesticides, pool chemicals and household cleaners. Items that are unacceptable are explosives, radioactive materials, tires, drums, ammunition and medical or business wastes.

There is a 20-gallon limit per item on paint, oil, gasoline, antifreeze and other automotive liquids. No single container may be larger than 5-gallons. All items should be in their original containers and must be clearly marked to identify their contents. For complete details, visit www.glendaleaz.com/HouseholdHazardousWaste.

# There's Still Time – Be Counted in the 2020 Census!

It's not too late to be counted for your community. Due to COVID-19, the deadline to respond to the 2020 Census has been extended. Census Bureau employees will begin going door-to-door to follow up with

households that have not yet responded in mid-August. Luckily it has never been easier to respond to the census on your own, without the need to interact with a Census Bureau employee face-to-face. Responding to the 2020 Census will take less than 10 minutes and can be completed online or by phone. Visit www.2020census.gov from a computer or mobile device or call one of these phone numbers for assistance: English 844-330-2020, Spanish 844-468-2020, TDD 844-467-2020. Each resident counted represents approximately \$3,000 yearly in state, federal and regional funds that support critical services in our community including public safety, education, healthcare, transportation, housing, parks, libraries and senior services. These programs are more important than ever as our community works to recover from this public health and economic crisis. Take 10 minutes today to be counted for Glendale's future. Now more than ever, we're all in this together!

The results of the 2020 Census will help determine how hundreds of billions of dollars in federal funding flow into communities every year for the next decade.
