## 2021 Glendale Family Bike Ride is Virtual

The annual Glendale Family Bike Ride is being reimagined and will be offered virtually this year! This is a new way for the community to come together and have fun while staying active and socially distanced! Each participant who completes the ride will receive a Glendale Family Bike Ride fanny pack!

Register online, grab your helmet, check your bike and take your family on a 6-mile bike ride in Glendale anytime between Saturday, April 10 – Saturday, April 17. Riders choose a 6-mile route of their choice or hop on a stationary bike and ride indoors. Ride at your own pace and complete the ride anytime during the week. ### Is Your Property in a Designated Flood Hazard Area?

Did you know some parts of Glendale are designated by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) as being in a special flood hazard area (SFHA)? Properties in these areas are required to purchase flood insurance as part of their home mortgage. However, other sections of the city are subject to flooding that are not shown on the Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM).

Glendale's Engineering Department has copies of the updated FIRMs for the entire city and can let you know if your property is in a special flood hazard area and may be able to let you know if flooding has been reported in your area in the past. The city's Engineering department also has copies of the most recent FEMA elevation certificates for some structures within the city as well as the updated floodplain ordinance on file.

All properties within Glendale can obtain flood insurance whether or not you are in a designated flood area. Remember, most standard homeowners' policies do not cover flood loss. Glass containers, inhalers, intravenous solutions, injectables and syringes cannot be accepted due to potential hazards posed by blood borne pathogens.
