

Barking Dogs can be a Nuisance

Dogs provide companionship, loyalty, love and fun to families. The security of knowing you have a real watchdog, as well as enjoying a peaceful and quiet neighborhood, is important to many people. Owning a dog also comes with some responsibilities towards your neighbors.

Barking is a dog's way of communicating, so not all barking is considered nuisance barking. Nuisance barking is persistent barking that negatively impacts a person's lifestyle such as barking regularly for long periods of time without a defined cause. Some tips for dog owners with a barking dog:

- Try to determine when and why your dog is barking excessively
- Provide distractions for your dog – toys and sound from a radio work
- Bring your dog inside when you are not home
- Be responsive to quickly address barking when you are home
- Provide daily exercise
- Train your dog
- Speak to your neighbor – they may be able to help you identify when and why your dog is barking so you can address the issue

Glendale City Code can address dog nuisances including excessive dog barking or howling that disturbs the peace and quiet of surrounding neighbors. A resident can report a barking dog issue by calling Code Compliance at 623-930-3610 or by visiting the web site at www.glendaleaz.com and entering information in the service request. The inspector will contact the owner of the dog and inform them of the concern.

The City of Glendale encourages responsible pet ownership. Please take care to ensure that your dog does not create any unreasonable noises or odors and that they are properly cared for.

Glendale Dial-A-Ride is a low cost, convenient curb-to-curb transit service providing service throughout the City of Glendale.

The service is available to everyone, and all vehicles are wheelchair accessible. Same day service is available Monday – Friday, and Saturday, Sunday, and Holiday service is available with advance reservations. ADA paratransit service is also available for eligible residents, based on fixed route schedules.

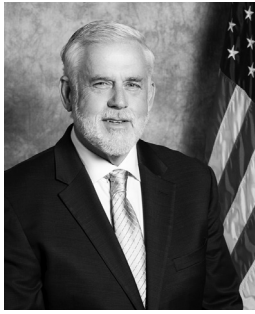

A Message from Mayor Jerry P. Weiers

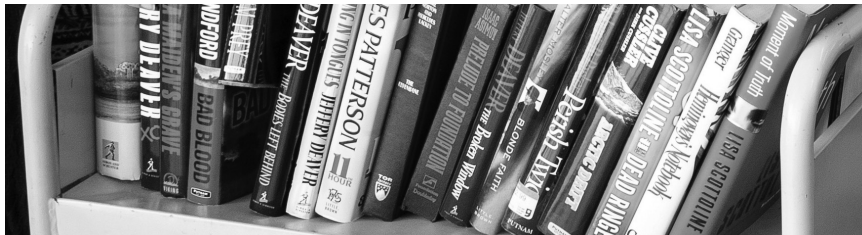
