



2021 Bulk Trash Collection Schedule



Your collection week will be:

Items must be ready for collection no later than Monday at 6 a.m. the week of your collection.

Residents may place bulk trash out no earlier than the Thursday before your scheduled service week (ex: Thursday, July 29 for Monday, August 2) and no later than 6 a.m. the Monday of your scheduled service week.

This gives you four days to place bulk trash out prior to your scheduled service week.

Failure to Follow Bulk Trash Rules Will Result in a Fine.

If a bulk trash pile is placed out prior to and/or after your scheduled service week, is placed incorrectly, or access is blocked or causes crews to perform collection other than by the normal method, you will be charged a fine of \$99, which will be automatically added to your monthly utility bill.

A Message from Councilmember Joyce Clark

Pay Attention

It is the middle of our Arizona summer and it is just plain hot. Water activities are especially attractive this time of year. Last year, eleven children under the age of five drowned in Maricopa County. Did you know that nationally, drowning is the number two cause of death for children one to four

years old? Did you know that babies can drown in as little as one to two inches of water? In most cases, child drownings are preventable.

I know every year the media offers reminders and tips to prevent child drownings but having heard them so often we tend to no longer pay attention. So, once again, here are the three most critical tips for every parent:

- · Teach your child to swim
- Learn CPR
- Pool toys, such as noodles, are not acceptable alternatives to a life jacket

A related situation is child deaths when left in a vehicle unattended. Nationally, fifty-three children died of vehicular heatstroke last year – the most in more than twenty years. **Here are some essential tips to prevent child heatstroke:**

- Never leave a child in a vehicle unattended even if the windows are partially open or the engine is running, and the air conditioning is on
- Create a reminder system by leaving a personal item such as a purse on the back seat or write a note and leave it in the front passenger seat

Inattention can be a killer at any age. Please pay attention to the most vulnerable, our children. Don't become just another statistic.
