## Glendale is Prepared for Drought

The Southwestern United States, including Arizona, has been in a drought for more than 20 years. This has greatly impacted the Colorado River system including Lake Mead and Lake Powell. The Colorado River represents approximately 36% of Arizona's collective water supply. Considering Arizona's priority system, the city of Glendale's Colorado River supply will not be reduced in the immediate future. Glendale has known for many years our Colorado River supplies could be cut and we have been preparing for this shortage for decades and will continue to do so. **These preparations include:**



- *Securing a diverse and robust water portfolio that includes renewable surface water, groundwater, and reclaimed water supplies*
- *Using reclaimed water to conserve potable water supplies*
- *Decreased reliance on groundwater*
- *Storing water underground for future use*
- *Investing in infrastructure, including wells to pump groundwater when surface water supplies may be reduced*
- *Supporting water conservation through ordinances and codes; developing conservation-based water rates; and offering an effective Water Conservation Program for people of all ages*

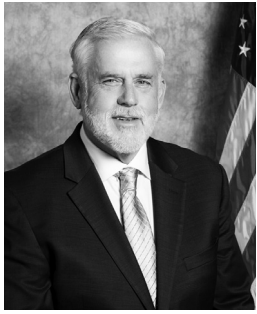
