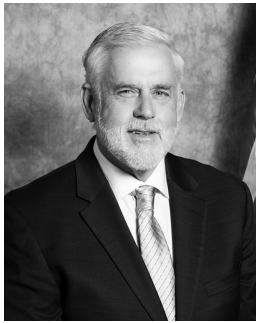

High School Students Apply Now!

My office has begun accepting membership applications for the 2023-2024 school year of the Mayor's Youth Advisory Commission (MYAC). To be eligible, a student must be attending 9th – 12th grade during the upcoming school year and must live within the municipal boundaries of Glendale or attend a high school within the municipal boundaries of Glendale. The goal is to maintain diversity that is representative of each Glendale high school as well as private school and home-schooled students. Membership is capped at 40 students, who are appointed by me. The application deadline is Friday, August 11, 2023.

The MYAC program, which meets the entire school year, allows students to be involved in their community while learning about city government, building self-esteem, widening their social circles, and discovering their talents and interests. Meetings are held monthly.

The MYAC members volunteer for group community service activities, raise funds for projects, and provide me with information from a teen's perspective. Some of MYAC's annual community service projects include purchasing Christmas gifts for local children in need, helping at veterans events, collecting canned goods for a local foodbank, assisting at city council district meetings, and more. Members are expected to complete at least 20 hours of community service annually to remain in good standing.
