

Fall 2023 Household Hazardous Waste Schedule

Dispose of unwanted household hazardous waste products by scheduling an at-home pickup between September 18 and October 13. An itemized list is needed, so please have that ready when you call to schedule your appointment. The actual collections will be handled October 9 through October 27. Call the Solid Waste Division at 623-930-2660 to make your appointment.

Hazardous materials that will be accepted include paints and wood stains, antifreeze and other automotive fluids, motor oil and filters, car batteries, pesticides, pool chemicals and household cleaners. Items that are unacceptable are explosives, radioactive materials, tires, drums, ammunition and medical or business wastes.

There is a 20-gallon limit per item on paint, oil, gasoline, antifreeze and other automotive liquids. No single container may be larger than 5-gallons. All items should be in their original containers and must be clearly marked to identify their contents. For complete details, visit www.glendaleaz.com/HouseholdHazardousWaste.

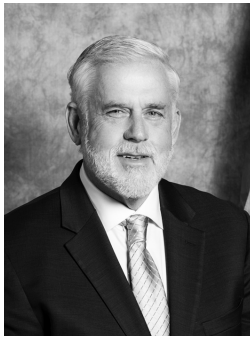

A Message from Mayor Jerry P. Weiers

A Commitment to Safer Streets and Public Safety

Glendale residents prioritize the safety of our community. That is the top issue in our community survey and other public forums. Our public safety is defined not only by our police officers and firefighters but also by safer roads, improved

intersections, and transportation investments which reduce congestion to help response times.

As Mayor, I have been committed to public safety and ensuring that our first responders have the resources and facilities necessary to keep our community safe. As such, the city council has voted to place two essential bond questions on the ballot this November.

The 2023 bond program is about addressing our city's critical needs. Question 1 asks voters to invest \$82 million in street and intersection improvements, including construction and reconstruction of major and local streets, highways, and bridges to improve safety and reduce congestion. Question 2 asks voters to invest \$78 million in public safety projects to build, modernize, and improve fire stations, police stations, police and fire training academies, police department forensic laboratories, and other public safety-related facilities.

Bonds are a fiscally responsible way to fund key projects that would help improve public safety, keep response times low, reduce congestion, and make safer intersections. Next month, the city will be hosting a series of open houses where people can learn more about the bond proposals and ask questions.
