A Message from Vice Mayor Joyce Clark

Learn More About Question 1 & Question 2

This month, the City of Glendale will be hosting a series of informational meetings regarding the November 2023 bond proposals. This is an excellent opportunity to learn more about Question

1 and Question 2 and have your questions answered. The dates and locations of the Open Houses can be found at www.glendaleaz.com/Bond2023.

The 2023 bond program asks the voters to invest in the essential needs of our city – proposing capital projects such as streets as well as fire and police facilities to reduce congestion and improve public safety. Here is a little bit more about the two ballot questions:

Question 1 asks voters to invest \$82 million in street and intersection improvements. Adequate transportation is necessary to move people, goods, and services throughout Glendale. Improving our streets and traffic signals reduces congestion, saves time, and enhances safety for all roadway users and pedestrians.

Question 2 asks voters to invest \$78 million in public safety projects. This proposal invests in fire and emergency support throughout the city by modernizing and updating current fire stations and building new ones. It will expand the capabilities of our police department to address important safety issues including crime and homelessness through investing in training, modern facilities, and forensics.

The deadline to register to vote is October 10, 2023. Ballots will be mailed to all registered voters starting on October 11, 2023.
