

CRIME PREVENTION TOOLS



Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) combines proper design and effective uses of the environment to increase security, improve quality of life, and potentially keep crime out of our Glendale businesses.

Applying simple CPTED practices into your business design can decrease crime and your Glendale Police Department is here to help! Not Built Yet? - Initial architectural plans can be reviewed by a Crime Prevention Specialist to assist in applying the principals to your design with the best possible safety and security precautions. Current Business? - An on-site CPTED safety and security assessment, inside and out by a Crime Prevention Specialist can be performed.

LIGHTING Replace all light fixtures with "dark skies" fixtures and install LED Lighting. These fixtures eliminate glare and shadows that make it easy for trespassers to hide. LED lighting allows true colors to be seen at night.



CAMERAS Surveillance is your 24/7 witness to help law enforcement catch criminals. Invest in quality surveillance with remote viewing. Place cameras inside and outside business.



LOCKS Keep your dumpsters locked and inside enclosures. Unlocked dumpsters can invite unwanted trespassers and activity. Any outdoor power supplies should also be locked to deter unwanted users.



LANDSCAPING Eliminate hiding areas and open the line of sight to increase natural surveillance. Trees and bushes should not block your business visibility or surveillance cameras. Unkempt landscaping can provide trespassers with spaces to hide.



The Glendale Police Department has developed the Glendale City Watch Program to allow businesses to provide real-time video surveillance feeds and situational awareness to officers responding to calls for service and emergencies. By partnering with the police department, businesses can help support police investigations to deter and resolve crimes on and around their property. The police department offers numerous ways to partner with businesses to complete this connection.

SIGNS Install appropriate No Trespassing signs in conspicuous locations on your property, and file a "Trespassing Enforcement Authorization Form" available though your GPD Community Action Team. Completion of this form pre-emptively authorizes GPD to enforce Criminal Trespassing within their discretion on your property.
