 - The City should continue to support and expand the good job that the West Area treatment plant and SCADA are currently doing
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- The City should complete and maintain a risk and vulnerability assessment to protect vital water resource infrastructure from any acts which might impact service quality
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- The City should pursue best practices and partnering opportunities with neighboring cities

- The City should ensure the long-term financial well-being of the system

- The City should coordinate stormwater planning with other infrastructure activities such as street maintenance

- The City should manage reclamation activities to maximize revenues

- Water resource programs should be fully considered in all city planning efforts
