



The History of Camelback Ranch-Glendale

About the Project

A state-of-the-art baseball facility like no other, Camelback Ranch in Glendale is the spring training home of the Los Angeles Dodgers and the Chicago White Sox. Located on 125 acres at 111th Avenue west of the Loop 101 between Camelback Road and Glendale Avenue, this Sonoran desert-inspired two-team facility uniquely reaches across both Glendale and Phoenix city borders. The park offers baseball fans more than top-quality playing fields and facilities; the site also features picturesque walking trails, landscaped grounds and an orange grove. Guests will also enjoy two ponds and a fully stocked lake between the Dodgers and White Sox facilities.

The first-rate baseball facility includes more than 118,000 square feet of Major and Minor League clubhouse space, 13 full baseball fields and three half-fields. It is also the largest in the Cactus League with a capacity of 13,000, which includes 3,000 lawn seats, 12 luxury suites and a party deck. Fans enjoy the ballpark's modern amenities and design as well as dramatic mountain views from within the park that create one of the most inviting Spring Training atmospheres in all of baseball.

More About the Project

Located just across the Loop 101 from Glendale's Sports and Entertainment District, this project complements the existing amenities in the area, providing additional venues and entertainment options to an area already expected to generate a regional economic impact of more than \$1 billion over the next two years.

This unprecedented project partners two of the state's largest cities in an effort to benefit an entire region. It will provide baseball fans, residents and tourists a full array of activities and

create economic and tourism opportunities that will make the region's newest sports and entertainment district like no other in the country.

Based on a 2006 Economic Impact Study conducted by Economic Research Associates (ERA), it is estimated that moving the Dodgers and White Sox will have a substantial economic impact for Glendale, Phoenix and the region. It is anticipated that the economic impact for the region could be as much as \$19 million per year.

Beyond Spring

In addition to serving as the Spring Training home of the Dodgers, the campus has become the home for all minor league operations throughout the year, including the team's Arizona League entry and Fall Instructional League team. This park also serves as the base for the White Sox Fall Instructional League, with an expanded overall presence in Glendale in the coming years.

This ball park will become a multi-use facility, available to host concerts, sporting events and corporate outings in addition to Spring Training baseball.

Breaking It Down

- The facility consists of a 10,000-seat stadium, with 3,000 lawn seats
- 118,000 sq. feet of major and minor league clubhouses for the two teams
- Four major league practice fields
- Eight minor league practice fields
- Two practice infields
- The site includes parking to accommodate 4,000 vehicles
