It's Not Too Late to Claim the **2020 & 2021 Recovery Rebate Credit** When You Don't Normally File a Tax Return

Most eligible people already received their stimulus payments and are not eligible to claim a credit.



If you're **eligible** and didn't receive the full 2020 or 2021 Economic Impact Payments, you may be eligible to claim the **Recovery Rebate Credit**.

To claim it, you must file a tax return even if you otherwise are not **required to file a tax return**. Your Recovery Rebate Credit will be included in your tax refund.

If you're eligible to claim the 2020 Recovery Rebate Credit, you must file a tax return by **May 17, 2024**, to claim the credit.

If you're eligible to claim the 2021 Recovery Rebate credit, you must file a tax return by **April 18, 2025**, to claim the credit.

IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) is a great option for people who are only filing a tax return to claim the **Recovery Rebate Credit**. Visit www.irs.gov/VITA to find the site nearest you and a list of what to bring.
