- Obtain and submit appropriate licensing packets(s) to the Tax & License Division
 - Applications for Business license, Liquor license and Special Regulatory licenses can be found on our website www.glendaleaz.com/taxandlicense/
 - Applications for Transaction Privilege Tax license can be found at AZTaxes.gov
- Get fingerprinted, if necessary
- Pay your fees

- Wait for the approval process which usually takes six (6) to eight (8) weeks for most licenses but can be sooner if all requirements are in order at the time of application

Things to know before starting your business

- Important local regulatory issues may require attention and if not in compliance with city regulations, could result in a delay of issuing a license
- Most businesses require a business license **and** transaction privilege sales tax license but may also require a special regulatory license
- Some licenses require background checks and you need to allow enough lead time for processing your license prior to opening your business
- Licenses are required for each business location
- If you are purchasing a business, you could be held liable for any unpaid taxes owed to the City by the seller. Make sure you obtain a Certificate of Compliance from the Tax & License Division.

Where do I Start?

Below is a list of Departments to contact for regulatory requirements.

Planning & Zoning (623) 930-2800

Located on the 2nd Floor of City Hall

- ✓ Verify zoning regulations allow your type of business at your location
- ✓ Verify parking requirements
- ✓ Group Homes **must** contact Planning & Zoning

Building Safety (623) 930-2800

Located on the 2nd Floor of City Hall

- ✓ All commercial-based locations **must** obtain Building Safety approval
- ✓ Verify your building or space has a certificate of occupancy (C of O)
- ✓ Most signs require a permit

Fire Department (623) 930-2800

- ✓ All commercial-based locations **must** obtain Fire Marshal approval
- ✓ Fire Permits & Plan Review -Hazardous Materials, Special Events, Fireworks
- ✓ Fire Prevention – Contractors lists, Codes, Standards, Inspections
