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GLENDALE POLICE DEPARTMENT RECEIVES RE-ACCREDITATION FOR 2012 BY C.A.L.E.A.

GLENDALE, Ariz. – On 7/21/2012 a board from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. (CALEA) awarded re-accreditation to Glendale Chief of Police Debby Black. A team of assessors from CALEA conducted an assessment April 23-26, 2012 to examine all aspects of the Glendale Police Department. This examination included an assessment of the department’s policies, procedures, management, operations, and support services.

The assessment is part of a voluntary process to gain accreditation, a highly prized recognition of professional excellence in the field of law enforcement. The goal of the assessment is to demonstrate that the Glendale Police Department is in compliance with over 400 professional standards, as established by CALEA. The Glendale Police Department was first accredited in the year 2000. The department received re-accreditation in the years 2003, 2006, 2009 and again now in 2012. This is an important achievement for the men and women of the Glendale Police Department. Members of the assessment team noted it was obvious, through what they observed during their visit, that the Glendale Police Department was committed to the accreditation process through the leadership of Chief Black.
