## Glendale Police Seek Help Identifying Persons of Interest

**Glendale, Ariz.** – On November 9<sup>th</sup>, 2013, at approximately 11:15 pm, Glendale Police Officers responded to the 4300 block of W. Northern Avenue reference a call of a shooting. Upon arrival officers located a male in his teens down in the parking lot with at least one gunshot wound. The victim, who is a Glendale resident, was transported to a local hospital and was later pronounced deceased. There is no known motive for the shooting at this time.

Glendale Police Detectives are seeking the community's help identifying persons of interest that the investigation has revealed are important to the case. Detectives have provided the attached surveillance photos of a dark colored, 4-door sedan vehicle they believe was occupied by at least two persons of interest they are seeking to identify. The surveillance photos are from the night of the shooting outside the front entrance / exit of the Fry's grocery store located at 4300 W. Northern Avenue. The surveillance footage shows the vehicle stop for a brief period of time in front of the main entrance of Fry's. The vehicle in question can be seen at the very top of the surveillance photos in the loading/unloading zone. The occupants got out of the vehicle briefly before getting back in the vehicle and driving away northbound onto Northern Avenue. The vehicle then continued eastbound towards 43rd Avenue.

The two occupants seen getting out of the vehicle are both described as dark-skinned males, both wearing light colored shirts. Detectives believe that the vehicle and its occupants were in the area at the time

of the shooting incident and are asking those two persons of interest to come forward and provide information about what they may have seen or heard. Glendale Police Detectives do not have information at this time that has identified any potential suspects and are asking for assistance in solving this case.
