Glendale Police to Host Shred Event

GLENDALE, Ariz. -- The Glendale Police Department is teaming up with the Target Corporation Saturday, April 17, 2010 for the city's "Shred It and Forget It" event. A free "drive-thru" event designed to promote public awareness about identity theft and fraud prevention. According to the Federal Trade Commission, identity theft impacts at least 9 million people each year. Shredding documents, instead of throwing them in the garbage, is an essential tool in combating identity theft.

Community members are invited to bring their unwanted personal documents to be shredded securely on site, free of charge. Law Enforcement staff will be on hand to assist residents with the shredding of up to three boxes (banker-size) of personal documents at no charge from 9 a.m. until noon (or the trucks get full) at the Target Store located at 10404 North 43rd Avenue.

Crime Prevention Specialists from the Glendale Police Department will be available to answer questions throughout the event.
