## **GLENDALE SEEKS PUBLIC INPUT ON IMPROVING WALKING AND BIKING IN GLENDALE**

**GLENDALE, Ariz.** – The city of Glendale is inviting residents and other stakeholders to an open house public meeting to receive input for the Glendale Active Transportation Plan. Attendees will be asked to provide their input on the current condition of non-motorized transportation in the city, and identify potential improvements. Two open house sessions will be held on Tuesday, Oct. 23, from 11:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. and from 5:00 p.m. - 7:00 p.m. at Glendale’s Main Library, 5959 West Brown Street.

### **Project Overview**

Active transportation includes any self-propelled, human-powered mode of transportation that actively engages people. Bicycling and walking are the two primary activities typically associated with “active transportation,” and it also encompasses running, skateboarding, scooters, inline skating, and the use of assistive mobility devices (such as wheelchairs). Glendale’s Active Transportation Plan will create an action plan to guide decisions and investments regarding where and how to improve and increase pedestrian and bicycle facilities in the city of Glendale. The project has already developed a comprehensive inventory of the existing active transportation network. The input from this public meeting will contribute to the development of a list of recommended facility improvements.
