New Pedestrian Countdown Signals Result of Councilmembers' Actions

GLENDALE, Ariz. – Glendale Councilmembers' David Goulet and Yvonne Knaack have combined funds from their respective council district budgets to pay for new pedestrian countdown signals recently installed at the intersection of 59th and Northern avenues.

The signals are designed to alert pedestrians on how many seconds of time remain to safely cross the street at the intersection. They also help clear the crosswalk before the traffic signals change.

Since the intersection borders the Barrel and Ocotillo Council district boundaries, Knaack and Goulet split the cost to purchase the equipment and pay for the installation.

The pedestrian signals were paid for with Barrel and Ocotillo District capital improvement funds.

The total cost of the project was \$3,249, which was split between the two district funds.
