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
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GLENDALE COUNCIL APPROVES IMPORTANT REZONING IN SPORTS AND ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICT

GLENDALE, Ariz. – A significant piece of development gets the green light to move forward in the Glendale Sports and Entertainment District after the Glendale City Council approved a rezoning application for the Sportsman Park Development Plan at University of Phoenix Stadium, which will allow as much as 4.6 million square feet of office, retail and dining space, including the development of two hotels and a series of parking garages.

Sportsman Park East and Sportsman Park West is a mixed use project, located on the property of the stadium on the east and west side. The development is in line with the city's Sports and Entertainment District's goal of offering visitors an opportunity to enjoy the ultimate fan experience, while also providing employment opportunities in Glendale and the West Valley and desirable access to Loop 101 Jobing.Com Arena, University of Phoenix Stadium and Camelback Ranch-Glendale, all of which helps continue the creation of a premier sports destination.

“One of the main aspects of this project is to continue to expand our Sports and Entertainment District and add value today and into the future for the hundreds of thousands of residents and tourists who visit this area every year,” said Glendale Planning Director Jon Froke. “In addition, the project will enhance the tailgating experience, as people will still enjoy traditional tailgating on the stadium's property but will now have additional options to explore when they come to a



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game, concert or event.”
