HOA ACADEMY PROVIDES FREE TRAINING FOR EXISTING HOMEOWNERS' ASSOCIATIONS

GLENDALE, Ariz.—In an effort to provide ongoing educational opportunities for residents, the city of Glendale will offer another informative Homeowners' Association (HOA) Academy this spring. The classes are aimed at providing useful tips to existing neighborhood HOA volunteers, residents and board members.

Glendale residents and HOA community leaders will get answers from specialists in the field regarding local, state and federal laws and HOA procedural best practices.

Helping build a knowledge base and pool of willing residents is the motivation behind this free HOA training series, which takes place Tuesdays during February at the Glendale Adult Center, 5970 W. Brown St. Two early evening classes will be held 5-6:30 p.m. on the first and third Tuesday and two afternoon classes will be held 2- 3:30 p.m. on the second and fourth Tuesday.

- Feb. 7, 5-6:30 p.m. – “Is Your Association in Good Health?”
- Feb. 14, 2-3:30 p.m. – “Arizona Open Meetings Law & Rules for Recording Meetings”
- Feb. 21, 5-6:30 p.m. – “Theft and Fraud of Association Funds Prevention”
- Feb. 28, 2-3:30 p.m. – “Parking, Enforcement and Street Maintenance”

To date, more than 850 people have taken the training to gain the tools needed to more effectively manage and lead their HOA. This training will be taught by representatives from the city of Glendale, and HOA attorneys from the Mulcahy Law Firm, P.C. who donate their time and expertise to teach the class.

Registration is required and is now open. The classes are free to Glendale residents and \$20 for non-residents. Early registration is encouraged as only a limited number of seats are available.
