*Glendale offers free class about “Vegetable Gardening in the Low Desert” on February 3*

Learn how to grow your own vegetables by attending the Glendale Water Services Department’s free “Green-Living” class on Saturday, Feb. 3, from 10 a.m. to noon at the Glendale Main Library, 5959 W. Brown St., Glendale.

Master Gardener Carol Stuttard will explain soil preparation, planting calendars, plant selection and watering in the desert climate. “Whether you’re a garden novice or expert, this class will have something for everyone by offering the resources and confidence to grow your own vegetables sustainably at home,” said Stuttard. “There’s nothing tastier than fresh vegetables picked straight from your own garden.”

The Green-Living class series will continue each month with new topics, guest speakers, and how-to resources for creating a more sustainable home. The next class will be held on March 10 at 10 a.m. and will be a “Walk and Talk” tour of the Glendale Xeriscape Demonstration Garden, 5959 W. Brown St., Glendale.
